

## WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP JORDAN

Try to plan ahead - bring as little baggage as possible, but don't short-change yourself.

### **BRING COMPLETED FORM #4 FROM THE APPLICATION PACKAGE and the signed COVENANT.**

**CLOTHING:** Bring sturdy, washable clothes for outdoor work and play; there is no need to bring anything dressy or expensive. PLEASE MARK EVERY ITEM WITH YOUR NAME. Write down a list of clothing items (and other items as well) that you bring so you can check to see if you are taking home the same items you brought to camp.

Count on one change of clothes for each day you will be at camp. Clothing items to include are:

| -blouses or shirts              | -"duck" shoes, vinyl or rubber-coated for wet weather                  |
| -long pants (at least one pair) | -swim suit(s)– MUST be modest, no "string" swimsuits will be allowed   |
| -shorts                         | -socks, and extra socks - A MUST                                       |
| -underwear                      | -shoes (a sturdy pair for walking and an extra pair)                   |
| -raincoat/poncho                | -sturdy sport sandals with straps are permitted <b>NO "FLIP-FLOPS"</b> |
| -sleepwear                      | -"watershoes" (a pair for around the pool, in a canoe, etc.)           |
|                                 | -jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt for cool nights                        |

**DRESS CODE:** Please DO NOT bring or wear the following: "string" swimsuits (if this is all you own, bring a t-shirt to wear over it), spaghetti strap tank tops, tube tops, midriffs, excessively low-cut tops, or pants/shorts that either ride up or sag to the point of exposing undergarments. Appropriate undergarments must be worn at all times (except in the pool). We come to camp to learn and play and respect one another in appropriate ways, and this includes being modest in attire. A good rule of thumb: if you can't wear it at school, most likely it is not appropriate for camp.

### **TOILET ARTICLES (in a small bag or case would be helpful)**

### **LINENS**

- twin sheets and a blankets AND/OR
- sleeping bag (sleeping bag is best and a necessity for the canoe trip)
- pillow and case(s)
- bath towels (at least two - one for bathing, one for pool)
- wash cloth(s)

### **MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS**

- notebook, pencil and/or pen, stamps, postcards (These items will be available in our Camp Store; but it would be best to start with your own supply.)
- insect repellent (a stick form such as Cutter's works well)
- sunscreen
- flashlight and extra batteries
- a book to read during rest time
- fanny pack, inexpensive camera, sports bottle for carrying water to activities
- laundry bag
- (optional) small electric fan

### **PLEASE DO NOT BRING**

- expensive clothing, jewelry, other personal articles
- radios, electronic computer games, tape players/recorders
- GUM
- food (we provide all the food you will need, including snacks)
- knives, hatchets, axes (we provide any tools needed)

A small amount of money may be left in the office which will be held "on account" for you to spend in the Camp Store if desired. A reminder that laundry facilities are NOT available to campers. A few personal articles may be washed by the counselor if absolutely necessary.
